THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY of Ordinary Time B 8 November 2015

My dear friends,

“People only die once and after that comes judgement; so Christ too offers himself only once, to take the faults of many on himself” (Heb.9:24-28). During the month of November, we remember and pray for the dead. This we do today, Remembrance Sunday as we remember and pray for those who died in the Two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. The Poppy and wreaths we use as a sign of remembrance of those who sacrificed their life in the cause of right. We thank God for their courage in action, and remember them with gratitude in prayer, as we place them in the Lord’s hands.

Jesus, our Great High Priest, sacrificed his life out of love for all people. He gave his life to give us freedom from sin and condemnation, and restore human dignity in the likeness of God. Christ’s sacrifice of his life on the Cross is made present to us at Mass and gathered around the altar, the place of sacrifice, we are united as his family in the Communion of Saints on earth, and with those who have died and share in his glory in heaven. We symbolise this during November, by placing the Names and Register of our Dead at the altar, and remembering the dead at the heart of every Mass in the Eucharistic Prayer.

We also remember our deceased relatives, parishioners and friends in prayer during November, which is traditionally known as the month of the Holy Souls. We pray especially for souls who are in purgatory or purification, that through Christ’s sacrifice they will be cleansed from the contamination of this life, and be made worthy to enter fully into God’s presence and glory in heaven.

Christ’s death and resurrection is central to the Christian faith, for we look to the hope of new life for all who have died, and for ourselves. “In Christ the hope of a blessed resurrection has dawned, so that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Lord, for your faithful people, life is changed not ended, and when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in the heaven” (Preface of Mass for the Dead). The promise of eternal life with God given through Christ, consoles us when we remember our loved ones who have died. It gives us hope that when we go from this life to the next we will be with them in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has risen from the dead. *May the risen Christ strengthen our faith and hope of eternal life.
