One of the things that I've discovered during my time as a priest is that it is often only after a person has died that you find out facts about their lives that you never knew about while they were still living.

A great example of this is the Italian Luigi Tarisio who lived in the 19th Century. Tarisio began his working life training as a carpenter but his great passion was violins and he went on to become a violin dealer and collector. The extent of his passion however was only revealed in 1854 after his death.

It was discovered that in Tarisio's very ordinary house, there were 246 violins, which he had been collecting all of his life, crammed into an attic. And these weren't any ordinary violins. Among his collection was a Stradivarius violin made in 1716 which had never been played.

The sad part about this story is that Tarisio's obsession in collecting violins meant that the world was robbed of all of the beautiful music which could have been played on those instruments.

Today's gospel reminds us about two important aspects which we need to keep in balance in our own lives as Catholic Christians. Jesus understood that the disciples needed time away in order to rest and to pray together. But when he saw the crowds who had gathered to hear him, he also understood that he needed to nourish and to provide for them as well.

We need both aspects in our lives: time devoted to prayer but also a willingness to put that prayer into practice in the service of our brothers and sisters. If either one is missing then we are in danger of being like the crowds in the gospel: like sheep without a shepherd. *Fr Dan*

Church Opening Hours: We are fortunate to be able to keep our church open most days during the week but sometimes the church has to be closed early if Father Dan is away or there is nobody available to lock up. As a rough guide these are the hours that the church is normally open during the weekdays:

Monday: 8am-3pm

Tuesday, Wednesday & Friday: 8am-7pm

Thursday: 8am-9pm

If you are unsure about whether the church will be open please do not hesitate to contact the Parish Office from 9am to 2pm Monday-Friday on 01277 624891.

Father Dan away: Please note that Father Dan will be away from Monday, 30th July to Friday, 3rd August and from Monday, 6th August to Friday, 10th August. On the days that Father Dan is away there will be no weekday Masses but the weekend Masses will be celebrated as normal.

Baptisms at Most Holy Redeemer: If you would like your child to be baptised at Most Holy Redeemer then you must first arrange an appointment to see Father Dan. Rather than emailing or phoning the parish office the best way to do this is to speak to Father Dan after the Parish Mass that you normally attend at the weekend. In order for a child to be baptised at Most Holy Redeemer at least one of the parents must be a baptised Catholic and we do expect parents to be attending Mass regularly with their children.

Parish Centre Alarm: All parish groups should be aware that the Parish Centre is frequently alarmed. If any groups do not know the code for the alarm then they should contact the Parish Office as soon as possible.

Emmanuel Church Car Park: A gentle reminder to parishioners to avoid parking in the Emmanuel Church car park when you come to Mass at the weekend. They have no spaces available for Funeral parking this week.
