

The lengthy gospel reading that we hear for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord completes for us the mystery of Christmas.

Jesus becomes 'completely like his brothers'. He is brought to the Temple to begin a life of service. His future path is foreseen by Simeon and Anna. His mother's pain is also foretold.

He is subject to his parents in the secret life of Nazareth. But, as Simeon already proclaims, He is set to be a 'sign of contradiction', 'a light for all the nations and the glory of His people Israel'.

How does this feast reconnect us with the Christmas mysteries?

What deeper significance does Jesus' coming to the Temple contain?

Consider on this feast of Candlemas how light is a recurring theme in Bible and liturgy.

We pray for all fathers and mothers that they may treasure their children as gifts of God.

Mass of Healing: 3pm on Saturday, 15<sup>th</sup> February This Mass is open to everyone and marks the World Day of the Sick and the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. The Mass will include the Sacrament of Anointing and is timed so that our ill and housebound parishioners are able to attend. What is a Jubilee Year? This year the Church is celebrating a Jubilee of Hope which began with Pope Francis opening the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in Rome and will end on the Feast of the Epiphany in January 2026. The concept of Jubilee or "Holy Year" has its roots in the Old Testament where a shofar, or ram's horn, would be blown to mark the beginning of a sacred year. This year would be marked by forgiveness of debts, land redistribution and the proclamation of justice. In the Catholic Church, the first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300 AD. Since the 1500's, these have occurred every 25 years. In 2025 the theme of this Year is "Pilgrims of Hope" and is a year of hope and trust for a world that is still suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of the Covid-19 pandemic and the increased threats to the climate. The aim of this year is to encourage a time of conversion and the forgiveness of sins.
