A message from Ed Harvey on multiplication:

My faith journey really started in May 2023 following a "Life in the Spirit" course. It radically changed my understanding of our faith and led to many changes in how I practiced my faith. It was quite a surprise to experience this after nearly 50 years as a practicing Catholic and at the age of 73. It all goes to show that it's never too late to really get to know Our Heavenly Father, Jesus and the Holy Spirit personally. This blessing is not something that I had earned in any way. It was a free gift from God as are the subsequent developments.

This experience in time led me to join one of the newly created Connect Groups at the start of 2024, which gave me an opportunity to share my experience with others and hear about their faith journeys. Everyone was very friendly and willing to share their thoughts, experiences, doubts and questions. The sessions were based around a series of videos about different aspects of faith followed by a discussion of the topic.

About 6 months later, after our summer break, the leader of the group had to travel to attend a funeral and would not be around for the next meeting. We were really looking forward to getting back together again, so I offered to host and lead the meeting.

I got a great deal of pleasure and joy from this and put my name forward to start a new group when an opportunity should arise. Attending a course of "Called and Gifted" confirmed my calling to start and lead a new group and gave me the confidence. The opportunity arose at the start of 2025. I invited a few friends to join me, and we started meeting in February 2025. It continues to be a lovely experience and we have the same sense of community that I found in the original group.

Other examples of multiplication are my joining the GIFT Programme as a volunteer and plans to start work as a volunteer chaplain at Mountnessing Court in the New Year.





YOUTH UPDATE

from Kristin DeFreitas, our Parish Family Co-ordinator

As a Parish, we are truly blessed to have so many families attending the weekend Masses. However, when I began my role as Family Coordinator three years ago, we were only just emerging from Covid. Many of the initiatives that existed before the pandemic had not restarted, and although we had a wonderful Children's Liturgy, there were very few opportunities for families to meet as a community outside of weekend Masses.

Over the past few years, we have worked hard to create more opportunities for our families to meet, socialise, and grow in relationship with one another. We now hold regular events such as the Gingerbread Gathering, Easter Baskets, and Kid's Club, as well as monthly refreshments—including waffles and cream—in the Pastoral Centre after the 11am Family Mass. Children and year groups from St Peter's School have also taken on active roles in the Mass, contributing through reading, singing, and other acts of service, which has been a wonderful blessing for our parish community.

Youth Engagement

Youth involvement was another area of concern. While we were strong at staying connected with children at primary school level, we tended to lose contact once they moved on to secondary school. This led to a steep decline in teenagers coming forward for Confirmation compared to the number of children receiving their First Holy Communion.

We realised that we needed a new approach—one that continued to build on the relationships as well as the faith formed in primary school. For this reason, we transitioned from a programme to a pathway and introduced GIFT (Growing in Faith Together). Although the pathway currently supports children in Years 3–6, our aim is that in time it will span from Reception through to post-Confirmation, helping our young people remain connected to their faith and to one another, even when they attend different secondary schools.

At present, 82 families are signed up to GIFT. We meet once a month to explore and discuss different faith-related themes. Children and parents spend part of the session together and part separately, allowing both shared experiences and age-appropriate learning.

Faith in Action

Another initiative designed to help children remain connected—to their faith and to each other—is our youth fundraising group, Faith in Action. It grew from witnessing how passionately children participate in the Christmas Shoebox Appeal, collecting toothpaste, toothbrushes, and small toys for homeless children who may not otherwise receive a Christmas gift. Our children care deeply about their community, about fairness, and about social justice.

In just three years, Faith in Action has raised nearly £6,000 for charities such as CAFOD, Mary's Meals, St Vincent de Paul, and Little Havens Hospice.

The children who joined the group in Years 4 and 5 are now in different secondary schools, yet they continue to stay connected through Faith in Action—and to their friends in the parish. Many of them have now begun attending BCYS events at Brentwood Cathedral, where they can meet and connect with other young Catholics from across the diocese.

Over the past few years, Faith in Action has gathered in the upstairs room of the Pastoral Centre to plan and bring their ideas to life. They have organised a variety of successful events, including BINGO nights, Street Markets, Lenten walks, and cake sales. One of the highlights has been their celebration of the rich diversity within our parish: families were invited to share desserts and sweet treats from more than 35 different countries, creating a vibrant and joyful community event.

Faith in Action has grown significantly—from a single group meeting in the church to three thriving groups, two of which now meet at St Peter's Primary School. As a result of this growth, we have completely outgrown our current meeting room upstairs. We are therefore delighted to share some very exciting news: we now have the opportunity to create our very own Youth Hub in the upper floor of the Pastoral Centre.

The Youth Hub will be designed as a welcoming "home-from-home" space. It will include comfortable seating such as sofas and beanbags for relaxing and socialising, as well as tables, chairs, and a screen to support planning, teamwork, and new projects.

Most importantly, the Hub will show our young people that we are investing in them—in their faith, their friendships, and their future. While it will primarily serve Faith in Action and the GIFT Youth pathway (as our current GIFT children transition to secondary school), the space will be available to others in the parish

who would benefit from a warm, homely environment. This may include our Confirmation candidates, a young adult connect group—especially helpful for those living at home without a space to gather—or any parish group seeking a more relaxed setting.

The Hub will also provide a much friendlier and more welcoming environment for meeting families preparing for baptism, offering a softer alternative to our formal meeting rooms.
